## Cookies explained

Cookies are meant to help and facilitate your web experience; they store a small text file that contains information on your computer. Cookies are for technical reasons, and there are many different types of cookies. One common type of cookie is session cookies, which only store information when you visit the website. Therefore, they work only when you have a website page open. These cookies are sent between your computer and the server to collect information.

## Our cookies

We use and collect cookies on our website to learn how our visitors navigate through the website and which content is more popular than the other. With this data, we can improve and develop our website to fit our visitors' needs better. We only use sessional cookies to give you a better web experience. These cookies' primary purpose is for our website to work correctly. The statistical data stored is exclusively stored at ELSYS. These cookies are explained more deeply below:

## Strictly Necessary Cookies

For the website to function correctly, we use sessional cookies that cannot be turned off in our system. The use of these cookies is for your own user experience and is set in response to you, which amounts to a request for services, such as logging in or filling in forms. It is possible for you to obstruct or alert you about these cookies but will, in response, inhibit some of the website's functions. These cookies do not store any personally identifiable information about you.

## Performance and statistics cookies

To optimize our website, we use sessional performance cookies to count visits and traffic sources. This enables us to know which pages are more or less popular and see how visitors use our website. We also collect your IP address to see your geographic location so we can analyze the relevance of the content in different regions. The data you provide will help us develop our website with relevant and accurate information.

## Turn off cookies
